Migrant Education Program



Overview

Region 3 of the Indiana Migrant Education Program is pleased to offer a wide range of services for its Migrant families. The main focus of MEP services is on the well-being and support of the child to succeed in schools. This can vary from instructional, to support, to referred services. All of which are outlined below, and more details can be found at the Region 3 - webpage and Facebook page.

Instructional Services

- In-Home Tutoring- When transportation is an issue the MEP hires tutors to work with students in their homes 2-3 days per week.
- After School Programs- Large
 concentrations of students will have After
 School Programs available allowing for
 students to stay at school to work with
 their teachers on homework and
 extending their lessons 2-3 days per
 week.
- MyON Online reading library for ALL Migrant students with over 4000 books available. Can be accessed through the MyON app or myon.com
- 1:1 iPad Initiative- K-12 students will be provided an iPad to help bridge the digital divide and give them access to online educational resources. (when available)
- In Class Assistance- Large concentrations for Migrant students will have access to Instructional Assistants that push into the classrooms.
- Summer School- The MEP is happy to offer Summer programming to ALL (K-12) Migrant students in Region 3. Some areas we partner with other organizations and others we run our own Summer school.
- Educational Field Trips- MEP funded educational trips are used to extend and expand student opportunities. We also help pay for costs associated with school field trips if requested and funds available.

Support Services

- Free Lunch and Textbooks
- Student & Family Advocacy- Assistance with transferring school documents, immunization records, school transcripts, etc.
- Medical, Dental, & Vision Support- The MEP works to connect families with the community health networks that provide free/reduced health care for Migrant students and parents.

Referred Services

- Community Networks- We have built partnerships with many local community organizations that we can refer families to for a variety of needs.
- Food Pantries, Shelters, Clothing, etc.- The MEP has several resources available to help locate community resources for our families.
- Childcare- The MEP helps parents locate quality childcare and pre-school programming.
- General Assistance- We do not have the ability to help families with energy assistance, medical costs, childcare costs, etc. but we do have community partners in some areas that could potentially help with these costs.
